

UPDATED COVID POLICY KEY NOTES:

As we begin to open and a post-pandemic life creeps closer within reach, we want to advise and strongly suggest you use caution in doing so. There is still much unknown about the transmission of this virus and the emerging variants. As a community we need to look out for one another. Please adhere to the below guidelines and show respect for fellow community members.

- Masks are still required while on community grounds at all times.
- While we <u>strongly</u> recommend scheduling a visit in our sanitized visiting centers (which you can now do online, see next page), however you are able to have up to 2 family members visit you in your apartment. These guests should be vaccinated for your safety and should be the only 2 guests permitted to enter.
- Quarantines are no longer required upon return to the community unless you have been in contact with a positive COVID case.
- If you choose to leave the community, we ask that you <u>do not</u> attend large gatherings or dine with guest. Eating and drinking requires you to remove your mask and that is not permitted.
- Guests are not permitted to walk the common areas and are instructed to go directly to the apartment they intend to visit.

In the event of a positive COVID case within the community or at the advisement of health and safety organizations, Dominican Oaks may be required to adjust these policies.

NEW COVID 19 SCAMS YOU MUST WATCH FOR!

Despite our warnings, residents continue to get hit with potential scams. Scammers are not only advancing technologically, but also emotionally. They are learning how to connect with their victims and use social engineering to gain access to your personal information.

How do I Recognize a Coronavirus Scam?

As with many fraud attempts, there are several red flags that can warn you that the offer is a scam and you should not click on any links or enter any personal or financial information.

- 1. Insists that you act now
- 2. Includes a request for personal, financial, or medical information
- 3. Directs you to open attachments and click on links
- 4. Email/ text starts off with a generic greeting and has spelling and grammatical errors throughout the message

If you get a call, text or email about the stimulus check or any other Covid relief bill, please analyze it carefully. Ask for a call back number and contact a family member or Dominican Oaks Administration for assistance and remember: the IRS will NEVER contact you via email, phone or text. Do not answer any questions to those who claim to be the IRS nor click on any link embedded in an email from them

OUR NEW WEBSITE IS LIVE!

A long overdue update to our website will be completed in three phases, with phase one live now.

In addition to a complete redesign, phase one features a <u>Guest Visit Reservation</u> tab that will allow you and family members to book a visit in our visitation centers directly from the site. You can find this tab at the top right corner on the Home Page. Visits must be booked online 24 hours prior to requested visit date. If the site does not allow you to book the day and time requested, then it has been booked and you must request a new time. We do recommend booking your visit as early as possible to ensure you get the reservation time you need. You or your guest is welcome to make the appointment and a confirmation email will be sent to the organizer.

We will be posting the newsletter as well as activities calendars to the website on the first of the month and can be found under the "About Us" tab and "Wellness and Resident Enrichment. Please encourage family members to check the site to keep updated on the community.

We plan on using the website to expand our communication to you and your loved ones as well as make accessing community information easier. Be sure to keep an eye out for some amazing changes.



We still recommend scheduling an appointment and visiting in our sanitized locations. The pandemic is not over and new variants are emerging leaving much unknown still. Please be safe and use caution. Dominican Oaks will continue to keep the health and safety for all residents, staff, friends and family a top priority. Please take advantage of the resources provided.
