#### WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT COVID BREAKTHROUGH CASES

Many of you have been asking why, given that you are fully vaccinated and so are your friends & family, do you need to continue to wear a face mask and maintain distancing?

The answer: breakthrough cases. None of the COVID-19 vaccines are 100% effective and we are seeing cases rise, even in fully vaccinated people.

Vaccine breakthrough cases are positive COVID-19 cases diagnosed in individuals 14 days after having fully completed a vaccination series authorized by the FDA.

These cases are expected however, occur in only a small percentage of vaccinated people. Due to this possibility, the CDC recommends that fully vaccinated people continue to take steps to <u>protect themselves</u> and others in many situations, like wearing a mask, maintaining an appropriate social distance from others, avoiding crowds and poorly ventilated spaces, and washing their hands.

75 million people in the United States have been fully vaccinated as of April 14th, 2021. Even though the vaccines are working as expected, asymptomatic infections and variants of COVID-19 will continue to cause some breakthrough cases. A New York senior living community recently saw 10 breakthrough cases. 15 communities in Oregon reported breakthrough cases with 3 of those reporting more than 30 cases each. Fortunately most of the cases reported mild symptoms proving that the vaccines are working, but there is still cause for caution. Not all of our residents and employees are vaccinated for health and personal reasons.

We are all navigating this pandemic together. There is still so much unknown about variants, strength and length of vaccine protection and the virus life cycle. Please, for the safety of the community members, staff, your friends and family, adhere to recommended health and safety guidelines for a bit longer. We hope this is the home stretch.

All visits must be made online and 24 hours prior. Drop ins or unscheduled visits are not permitted. We are **required** to sanitize after each inapartment visit. These appointments help keep this process organized, fair and safe.
